- Road cleanup for Adopt a Highway is May 15<sup>th</sup> at 4:00pm (note time change!) – meet at the church and scouts pick up trash along Penn Grant Road. It takes less than an hour. Split into two groups to go in each direction from the church to pick up trash. Scouts will wear vests and gloves. Afterwards, there will be a camp out at the Anderson farm. Scouts working on Cooking merit badge will cook. There will be some competitions and one will focus on fire building as that is something they seem to struggle with at Klondike. This is local, so if scouts have sports on Saturday, they can show up afterwards. Will also be emptying out the trailer to see what is needed and reorganize. There are tents in the trailer that the scouts can use for camping. There is a packing list for camp outs on the Troop website.
- Chicken BBQ Saturday May 8<sup>th</sup> – can sell in person tickets or people can buy on the Google link that was emailed out. Will need older scouts there early (around 5-6am) and then younger scouts show up around 9:30am. Tracy will send out a signup genius to see who is planning to help.
- Will need to wrap potatoes on Friday May 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm – Tracy is checking to see if it can be done at West Willow Fire Company. Amanda has an alternate location to use that has water and can set up tables.
